### Can you find the tallest tree in Dunbar?

John Worrall and Tony Molyneux are asking the citizens of Dunbar to help identify the tallest tree in our neighbourhood. This Salmonberry Days contest is open to anyone living in the Dunbar neighbourhood.

By using the simple method illustrated on this page, you can obtain a fairly accurate estimate of a tree's height. Go out and look around until you find what you think is the tallest tree within the boundaries of our neighbourhood. Make careful note of the location and then submit your entry to our "Tallest Tree" contest. John and Tony will review all of the entries that come in during the month of May. The winner(s) will be announced at the Dunbar Salmonberry Fair on May 30!

Here's how you can enter:

- Phone the Dunbar message line (604-222-9824) and leave your name and phone number and the location of your tallest tree
- Visit the Dunbar website ([www.dunbar-vancouver.org](http://www.dunbar-vancouver.org)) and click the link to Tallest Tree in Dunbar.

Meanwhile, come out and join John Worrall, UBC Emeritus Professor of Forest Sciences, on a walk during Salmonberry Days to learn more about the trees that contribute to Dunbar's character.

The heights of trees (or any other tall object) can easily be found using a metre stick (or yardstick). Stand exactly 5 metres (25 feet) from the tree being measured. Hold the metre stick, with the zero end downward, 50 cm (25 inches) from your eye. Line up the bottom of the metre stick with the base of the tree. Without moving your head, look to the top of the tree. Where it crosses the metre stick, read off the measurement in centimetres (inches). Each 10 cm (inch) will equal one metre (1 foot) of the tree's height. If the tree is taller than your stick will measure, stand 10 m away. Again hold it 50 cm from your eye, but this time multiply your result by 2 to get the correct height. If it is taller still, then step back to 15 m, multiplying your result by 3, step back 20 m, multiplying the result by 4, etc.

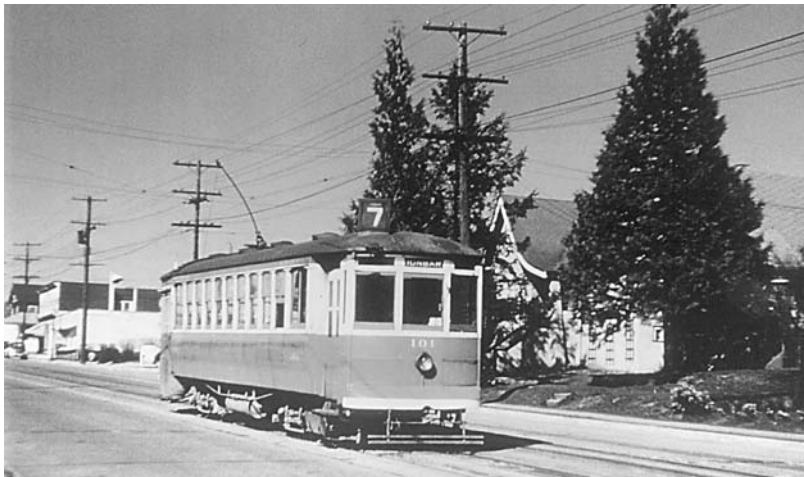
